## **Call for participation**

Are there specificities unique to evaluation in SSH? What are the stakes for the careers of researchers? What are the stakes for institutions in a context of increasingly strained budgets? The University of Geneva is organizing an interdisciplinary workshop for PhD and Postdoctoral researchers in the social sciences and humanities (SSH) in order to discuss such questions. This international workshop focuses on methods and challenges for the evaluation of SSH research projects, and also on the evaluation methods applied to the careers of SSH researchers. 
In this workshop, young researchers will investigate collaboratively to define a common basis for the evaluation criteria of quality research, and they will reflect on SSH specificities. Last but not least, the workshop will enable the participants to discuss the quality of their own research and the work of the others and exchange ideas with their peers about their paper.
